# C) Assessment of existing Programmes and rationalization of Schemes and Programme:

The Department will immediately review all the existing schemes and if required necessary changes will be made to the schemes for achieving the target.

### D) Programmes and Schemes in 3 (three) years action plan:

The Department proposes to focuses on the following schemes and programmes in the medium term (2016-17 to 2019-20)

## I. SPORTS:

- ➤ Physical Education is an extra-curricular activity in schools at present. Focus will be given on making the subject of Physical Education a compulsory subject in High and Higher Secondary Schools.
- A curriculum of Physical Education will be developed in collaboration with LNIPE, Sonapur, Assam.
- Physical Instructors for implementing the curriculum of Physical Education will have to be engaged in a phased manner. The infrastructures for Physical Education in the Schools are to be developed.
- > Sports Coaching Centres in Block and District level will be established. A number of coaches for various disciplines are to be engaged.
- > State level Sports Academies for more disciplines which include Wrestling, Archery, Weightlifting and Taek-Won-Do are proposed to be established.
- > Sports Scholarship, Grants-in-Aid, Award, Reward, Incentive and Sports Pension are to be paid to the talented and deserving sports person.
- > Development of Sports infrastructure at potential and uncovered rural and urban areas will be taken up.

- Yoga Centre "NIRVAAN" imparting regular Yoga Classes by trained Yoga Instructors will be established in each District Head Quarter under PPP mode.
- School Tournaments and Rural Sports Tournament at Block, District and State level will be taken up for promotion of sports at grass root level.

### II. YOUTH AFFAIRS:

- ➤ The enrolment of Cadets in NCC in High School and Higher Secondary Schools will be enhanced. All Higher Secondary Schools / Colleges are to be covered by NSS. For Bharat Scouts and Guides there will be 3 training centres in 3 zones.
- Vivekananda Yuva Kendra in each village of the state to be setup. These Vivekananda Yuva Kendra will be affiliated with the Vivekananda Youth Centre proposed to be established in Guwahati. Awareness programmes, Capacity building programmes and training programmes for the members of the Vivekananda Yuva Kendra's will be taken up.
- ➤ Skill development for specialized jobs related to sports like Sports Physiotherapists, Sports Nutritionists, Fitness Trainers, Sports Psychologists etc. for engagement in state Sports Academies, Private Sports Academies State / District Sports Coaching Centre will be taken up through Employment Generation Mission in PPP mode.

# E) <u>IMMEDIATE</u> <u>CHANGES</u> <u>IN POLICIES, ORGANIZATIONAL FRAMEWORK,</u> <u>PARTNERSHIPS AND INTRODUCTION OF INNOVATION ENVIRONMENT NECESSARY</u>

The policy and institutional change to be pursued are:

- ➤ Measures to improve co-ordination with the Education Department for introducing Physical Education as compulsory subject in schools and also to develop the curriculum for Physical Education.
- ➤ Measures to facilitate the participation of Private sector in developing sports and sports infrastructure.

### F) MEDIUM TERM RESOURCE FRAMEWORK:

The resources for achieving the target will be finalized annually in conformity with the annual budgetary provision. Steps will also be taken up for resource mobilization through CSR provision of PSU's/MNC's, Private sector funding and community resources.

### G) <u>REVIEW</u>:

The action plan and schemes will be reviewed periodically and any modifications, changes can be made for achieving the Assam Vision, 2030 Goals.

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
